**SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS**

1. All candidates for a degree in Comparative Literature must complete the graduation requirements listed in the General Catalog.
2. A minimum of 33 upper-division units must be completed for the Comparative Literature major, Plan II, to include:
  - 18 units in one of the three areas (A, B, or C on reverse side);
  - 6 units in a foreign language literature (read in the original language);
  - 6 units in another literature (which may be British or American) read in the original language;
  - 3 units, ENGL 308W.

**NOTE:** It is strongly recommended that even those students choosing English or American as their second literature attain competency in a second foreign language.  
No more than 48 upper division units in Comparative Literature and English courses can apply to the degree.
3. A minor is not required for a major in Comparative Literature.
4. Graduation Writing Assessment Requirement: Passing the Writing Proficiency Assessment with a score of 8 OR above and English 308W with a grade of C (2.0) or better.
5. This is not the Comparative Literature major that prepares you to get the Single Subject Teaching Credential in English. Students intending to teach in high school should complete the "Program and Checksheet for the Comparative Literature Major in Preparation for Single Subject Teaching Credential" available from the English Department. Students interested in the Single Subject Teaching Credential in English should refer to the General Catalog and visit the Office of Student Services for the College of Education in BA 255 for information about the credential program.
