**SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS**

1. All candidates for a degree in Comparative Literature must complete the graduation requirements listed in the General Catalog for the year they declared their major.
2. No more than 48 units in upper division Comparative Literature and English courses can apply to the degree without a petition from a department adviser.
3. All Liberal Arts and Sciences degrees require three semesters of one foreign language or the equivalent (see General Catalog).
4. A minor is not required for a major in Comparative Literature.
5. Graduation Writing Assessment Requirement: Students must have fulfilled the Writing Proficiency Assessment with a score of 8 or above before taking English 308W. Comparative Literature majors are required to take ENGL 308W.
6. This major leads to a Bachelor of Arts degree. **Six additional units are required for admissions into the Teaching Credential Program**; acquisition of the Credential itself requires post-baccalaureate coursework in the College of Education. Students are urged to familiarize themselves with the procedure of that College and with the other special requirements it may have for admission to the Credential Program.
