SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS

1. All candidates for a degree in Comparative Literature must complete the graduation requirements listed on pp. 174 in the 2004-2005 General Catalog.
2. A minimum of 30 upper-division units must be completed for the Comparative Literature major, Plan II, to include:
18 units in one of the three areas (A, B, or C on reverse side);
6 units in foreign language literature (read in the original language);
6 units in another literature (which may be English or American) read in original language
No more than 48 units in Comparative Literature and English courses can apply to the degree.
3. All Liberal Arts and Sciences degrees require three semesters of one foreign language or the equivalent (see page 74, 2004-2005 General Catalog).
4. A minor is not required for a major in Comparative Literature.
5. The following courses satisfy the upper-division university writing requirement: English 508W, 581W, 584W, or RWS 500W with a grade of C (2.0) or better.
6. This is not a Comparative Literature major that prepares you to get the Single Subject Teaching Credential in English. Students intending to teach in high school should complete the “Program and Checksheet for the Comparative Literature Major in Preparation for Single Subject Teaching Credential” available from the English Department. Students interested in the Single Subject Teaching Credential in English should refer to the General Catalog and visit the Center for Careers in Education (BA 255) for information about the credential program.
