PLEASE NOTE

- The Comparative Literature major is an impacted program. Students are accepted into the program as pre-majors until they successfully complete the Preparation for the Major requirements below.
- A minimum of 33 upper-division units must be completed for the Comparative Literature major, to include,

24 units in 400- or 500- level ECL courses 6 units in 500- level ECL courses 3 units, ECL 508W

- All Liberal Arts and Sciences degrees require three semesters of one foreign language or the equivalent (see University Catalog).
- A minor is not required for a major in Comparative Literature. The department offers three <u>certificate programs</u> for students wishing to take additional courses in Creative Writing, Creative Editing & Publishing, and Children's Literature. (It is not possible to major and minor in the same department.)
- Graduation Writing Assessment Requirement (GWAR): Comparative Literature majors must register for ECL 508W and earn a grade of C (2.0) or better. See <u>Graduation Requirements</u> in the University Catalog for a complete listing of requirements.
- Students interested in the Single Subject Teaching Credential in English should contact the undergraduate director and visit the Office of Student Services for the College of Education in EBA 255 for information about the credential program.

Preparation for the Major - 9 units (three courses)

Courses in preparation for the major must be completed with a minimum GPA of 2.50 and a grade of C or higher. To advance from pre-major to major a student must also have a cumulative GPA of 2.40 or higher.
